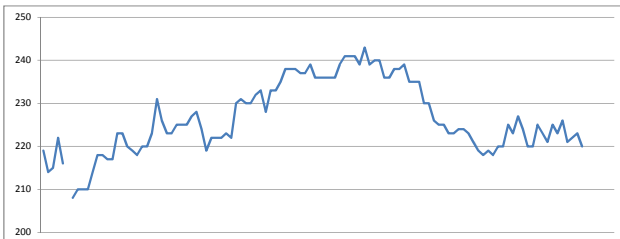

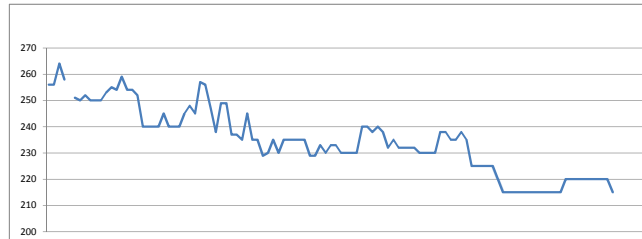
**Comments**

CBOT beans led the market lower after US suppliers are finally seeing Chinese demand swing towards S. American soybeans, the whole soybean complex was weaker, the stronger US dollar not helping at all. The sell off in the bean pit had a serious knock on effect on canola resulting in substantial losses in ICE canola futures. Paris rapeseed futures were lower but by no means as soft as the US and Canadian markets. Chicago wheat futures were caught up in the selling after the USDA posted some less than inspiring weekly export data. Local markets are getting hard to negotiate as more and more sorghum makes its way onto the market, if you are looking to place sorghum over the next two months don't leave it until a week before you want to sell it to find a home, you simply wont find one, or maybe you will.....at a price. Small tonnage was done at \$176 ex farm Mullaaley yesterday but the bulk of the larger volume bids were closer to \$175, delivery slots are getting further out with most buyers now looking for a May / June option at least. Old crop wheat was pretty flat with bids still around the \$190 mark with most sellers closer to \$200. Track wheat was traded at the bid as small parcels continue to trickle onto the market, longer term wheat on the track continues to show all the signs of a range bound market. With forward contracts only showing a minimal premium over old crop prices it is hard to see any big moves unless the Northern Hemisphere leads the way.

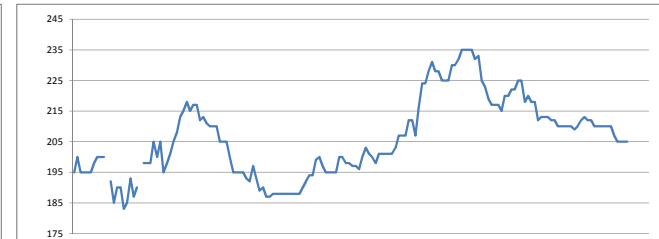
**H2 Wheat Track NTL Mid Sept - Current**
